Bylaws 7.02.3.2 "Reserve Fund" requires we retain 50% of the operating budget in reserves. At the close of 2023 we are exceeding our Bylaw requirement with more than 100% in reserves. (The 2023 operating budget was approx. \$146,941. As of December 7, 2023, there is a combined \$127,679.69 in savings and checking.)
